The SA Media service is unique in that it offers a press clipping service covering 39 of the mainstream publications in South Africa from 1978 to date. At the moment, we have over 4,5 million news articles in the archive, a number that will grow by about 2500 selected news articles per week. The selection is based on specific subjects.

When you subscribe annually to this service, you can be sure that you have one of the most comprehensive tools available when searching in all mainstream local publications on any topic. All the articles are full text and every word in every article is searchable. We have recently started adding all the images and photographs in full colour to give you the original article for your research.

You can search an array of newspaper sources and download them in PDF format for easy printing and archiving.

Currently we cover 19 daily publications, 17 weekend publications, two weekly publications and one monthly publication. Sabinet's in-house Digitisation department scans and indexes the selected articles daily. Here is a list of the SA news sources we have available.
